Secret Sauce of the Promise Neighborhoods Movement


- Focus on 10 results that make a big difference for low-income children
- Measure progress on 15 indicators against baselines
- Understand why the indicators are trending in a particular direction
- Select partners for each indicator
- Work with partners to develop selection criteria and identify solutions for each indicator
- Entire team commits to population-level targets by indicator
- Select a mix of solutions for each indicator
 - a. Families
 - b. Programs
 - c. Policies
 - d. Systems
- Performance measures, incorporate into action plans and begin implementation
- Develop performance contracts with partners (If applicable)

To achieve collective impact, multiple sectors must contribute.



We go out of our way to take on the big challenges, providing in-the-trenches support in each Promise Neighborhood.

And we hold ourselves accountable by measuring our impact nationally using the same indicators our local partners use.

Operating Principles and Competencies*

PROMISE NEIGHBORHOODS OPERATING PRINCIPLES

COMPETENCIES REQUIRED TO IMPLEMENT THE PRINCIPLES

Serve an entire neighborhood comprehensively and at scale.

- 1. Business Planning: Develop a business plan
- 2. Sustainable Financing: Create a financing plan
- 3. Public Policy: Address policy and regulatory issues

Create a comprehensive pipeline of effective programs for children from birth through college graduation, and wrap that pipeline in supports for families.

- Pipeline of Services: Develop a multi-sector system of support using a mixture of solutions based in families, programs, policies and systems
- 5. Accountable Partnerships: Structure effective and accountable partnerships across systems

Build community among residents, institutions and stakeholders who help to create the environment necessary for a child's healthy development.

- 6. Community Engagement: Meaningfully engage children, youth, families and community stakeholders
- Constructive Conversations: Foster constructive dialogue about gender, race, class, culture and systems change

Evaluate program outcomes and create a data feedback loop to help management improve and refine program offerings.

8. Use of Data: Use data for learning, continuous improvement and shared accountability

Cultivate a culture of success rooted in passion, accountability, leadership and teamwork.

- Results-Based Accountability: Use a disciplined approach to move from talk to action in order to achieve population-level results
- 10. Leadership Development: Deepen the organizational and collaborative leadership capacity in the lead agency and partners in service of population-level results
- 11. Communications: Develop a communications plan
- 12. Results-Driven Work: Turn a curve away from the baseline or beat the baseline on one or more indicators associated with the Promise Neighborhood results
